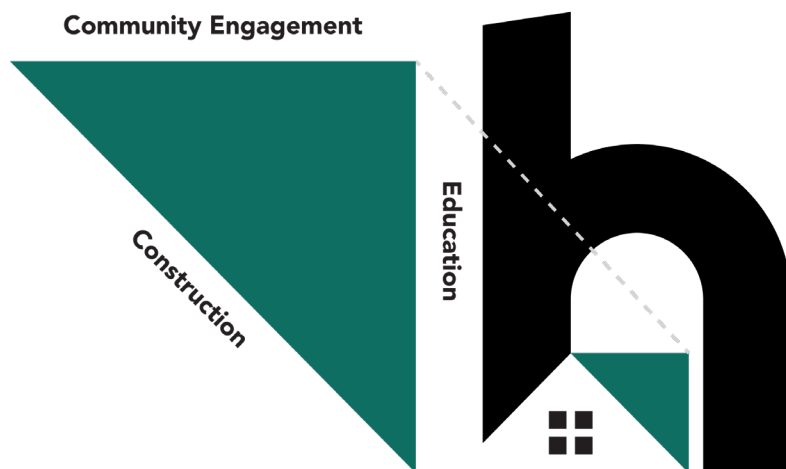
HomeAid is a national nonprofit organization with 19 affiliates spanning diverse communities. As an organization, HomeAid has completed over 1,000 developments, providing safe and dignified housing for over 500,000 people experiencing homelessness. HomeAid expanded its reach to Utah five years ago, cham-

pioned by the visionary leadership of our founding Board President, Nate Shipp. Since then, our community's generosity has fueled our efforts to make a lasting impact right here in Utah. We've completed 16 build projects, with 4 more in progress, organized 5 diaper drives, donated 36,000+ unique items to support

service providers, and distributed nearly 500 cold weather and art kits to those in need in our community. Our commitment remains strong as we continue to strive for positive change and empowerment for those in need.

What Makes HomeAid Unique? HomeAid maximizes the impact of donor dollars by ensuring that each contribution generates tangible results for those in need. Unlike traditional models where one dollar donated equals one dollar spent, HomeAid leverages donations to achieve an average 10x return on investment (based on 2023 figures). This means that every dollar donated has the potential to create substantial and lasting change. By directing contributions to various service providers, HomeAid ensures that donations continue to serve the community at large, benefitting dozens, hundreds, and even thousands of individuals in need over time. This approach underscores HomeAid's dedication to providing sustainable and meaningful assistance to homeless and underserved populations, far surpassing the limited impact of one-time or one-off donations.

THE INN BETWEEN

The INN Between seeks to end the tragic history of vulnerable people dying on the streets of our community by providing a supportive and safe haven for people who have nowhere to go during a medical crisis. Prior to The INN Between, no adequate solution existed for housing terminally ill and medically frail homeless

people, resulting in an average of 50 deaths on Salt Lake area streets annually. As the ONLY medical respite provider for people experiencing homelessness in the greater Salt Lake area, The INN Between plays an important role in our community. Since self-reliance and personal responsibility are core values

of the program, the Inn Between strives to provide resources such as a laundry room to enable clients take pride in their personal responsibilities. Because of The INN Between, 122 individuals have passed away sheltered in comfort and dignity.

THE ROAD HOME
MIDVALE FAMILY SHELTER

The Road Home's Midvale Family Shelter is a private non-profit social services facility that assists families experiencing homelessness in Salt Lake County and along the Wasatch Front. The Road Home provides multiple services to help individuals overcome homelessness. In 1998 The Road Home began operating the Community Winter Shelter for men in a former celery warehouse in Midvale. In 2010 they transitioned the facility to serve families with children. In 2012 they renovated the building, and in 2015 they opened the new two-story facility. This emergency shelter includes office and communal spaces, dining and cooking facilities, a dorm-style sleeping area, and access for people with disabilities. The Midvale Family Resource Center serves up to 300 people nightly, with onsite case

management and on and off site community partners. In 2020 their grassy play area was marred by FEMA tents. The grass was killed and only dirt remained. This area is the only outdoor play area for kids staying at the shelter. The families living at the shelter needed a safe place to escape the realities of homelessness. HomeAid stepped in with Utah West Landscape, Hymas Landscape, JB Waterworks, Rocky Mountain Turf, Twin Pines Nursery, Sunstate Equipment, Richin's General Engineering, Woodside Homes, Evergreen, and Kristin Andrus to rehabilitate the space. After seeing the turf for the first time, a little girl living at The Road Home's Midvale Family Shelter said, "They built this for us?!" We hope this area will help cultivate community for those who walk through their doors for years to come.

THE FOOD AND CARE COALITION CANDLELIGHT VILLAS



The Food and Care Coalition (FACC) is the primary provider of homeless services in Utah County. Not only does it provide 38 units of onsite transitional housing but also a dining hall, food pantry, clothing and essentials, a computer lab, laundry, showers, mail delivery, and an onsite dental clinic.

However, once individuals had stabilized in transitional housing, it was difficult for them to secure market rate housing given the extremely competitive market driven by students attending nearby Brigham Young University and Utah Valley University. Even with housing vouchers in hand, longer term housing was scarce and offered little to no ongoing support.

FACC developed plans to utilize the excess acreage behind their existing facility to create the Candlelight Villas, 72 units of permanent supportive

housing, and a partner building for collaborative providers to provide onsite mentoring, training, and other supportive services. The entire ground up construction of this project exceeded \$11 million dollars. Through HomeAid's unique relationship with the homebuilding industry and our generous supporters, we saved FACC over \$910,000.

HomeAid leveraged \$300,000 of funds provided by Academy Mortgage to encourage donation of an additional \$610,000 in cash, discounts and in-kind materials and labor. Major contributors included Staker Parsons, GE Appliances, Burton Lumber, LKL Associates, Anthony Antonelli, Metrie, Tanner Glass & Hardware, Carpet Diem, Jeff Adams Design, BioGrass, Stratton and Bratt, DAI, Liberty Homes and Lennar.

The grand opening of the Candlelight Villas at Food and Care Coalition took place on June 29, 2022 and have been quickly filling with residents in need; residents grateful for a dignified, safe place to call home.

THE FAMILY SUPPORT CENTER

LIFESTART VILLAGE AND CLINICAL EDUCATION



The Family Support Center's Lifestart

Village is designed to move single parents with children from dependency to self-sufficiency. Single parents and their children move from homelessness or near homelessness into safe, stable housing where they develop the necessary skills to create a stable, nurturing environment. In the dorm-like Phase I, and under the direction of a full-time director, the parents learn to become self-sufficient. They receive Life Focus training, parent education, financial budgeting education, are assisted in completing their GED and acquiring and maintaining adequate employment. Upon completion of Phase I, parents can graduate to a self-sufficient rental town home or cottage, Phase II.

The Family Support Center's Clinical

Education specializes in treating children 6 years and older, adolescents, adults and families who have had their lives impacted by trauma and abuse. They utilize evidence-based therapeutic tools to help our clients improve their quality of life.

RED BARN ACADEMY

Red Barn Academy is a transformative residential life-skills program, nestled within the picturesque and tranquil setting of a working farm. This remarkable initiative provides a safe haven and a fresh start for men who have faced significant challenges in their lives, stemming from addiction, involvement in criminal activities, or experiencing the hardships of homelessness.

What sets Red Barn Academy apart is its unwavering commitment to these men's rehabilitation, all offered without charge. The program spans a comprehensive two-year duration, during which participants embark on a journey of profound self-discovery and personal growth. Unlike traditional drug

treatment approaches, Red Barn Academy places a primary emphasis on behavior modification and character development, recognizing that true transformation extends beyond mere sobriety.

At its core, Red Barn Academy is a therapeutic community, where the ultimate goal isn't just achieving sobriety but, equally importantly, fostering honesty, accountability, and the acquisition of skills to lead a life deeply rooted in values and integrity. Residents are provided with the tools and support necessary to rebuild not only their lives but their sense of self-worth and purpose.

The program involves not only farm work but also the opportunity for residents to contribute to various enterprises operated under the Red Barn umbrella. This approach not only helps individuals develop a strong work ethic and valuable job skills but also reinforces the sense of responsibility and teamwork that is central to the Red Barn Academy experience. Through this holistic approach, residents are not only given the chance to rebuild their lives but also to develop the skills and mindset required to thrive in their journey towards a brighter future.

THE OTHER SIDE VILLAGE

The Other Side Village is a master-planned tiny home neighborhood that provides affordable, high-quality, permanent housing for individuals transitioning out of chronic homelessness. Their model emphasizes the importance of community and personal growth, creating a social system that lifts and changes all who are part of it. Once operational, The Other Side Village will reach self-sufficiency through its social enterprises, enabling them to cover operational expenses without relying on ongoing donations or operating funds. HomeAid Utah is committed to building the

first tiny home sub-village at The Other Side Village, consisting of 10-15 homes. Our first home was showcased in the 2023 Salt Lake Parade of Homes. The community joined us and witnessed the difference a strong community and housing can make for those experiencing homelessness.

THE SEAGER MEMORIAL CLINIC

The Seager Memorial Clinic is currently located at the Ogden Rescue Mission and has been serving the homeless, indigent, and working poor of Northern Utah since 1988. They are a non-profit organization dedicated to providing free healthcare services. The Clinic's mission is to provide free, easy-access, non-judgmental, charitable medical, dental, vision, and mental health care to the underserved. Everything they do is provided 100% free to those seeking care. Since its inception, The Seager Memorial Clinic has provided care for over 82,000 individuals and has become an essential resource for those who cannot afford medical care. 60% of patients at The Seager Memorial Clinic are uninsured, 40% have no household income, and 25% of them live on under \$1,000 per month. Without the Seager Memorial clinic, these individuals do not have access to affordable healthcare.

Healthcare is an essential need. Ensuring inclusive and high-quality healthcare services is crucial for fostering and preserving well-being, curbing and treating illnesses,

minimizing preventable diseases and premature death, and attaining equitable health outcomes for all citizens of our community.

The Seager Memorial Clinic has experienced remarkable growth, necessitating a move from its former location within the Ogden Rescue Mission. Thanks to the support of compassionate individuals and generous donors, they successfully acquired a building formerly dedicated to genealogy by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. Now, as the Seager Clinic settles into its new home, it seeks assistance from HomeAid and its extensive network of donors and skilled trade professionals to undertake the transformation of this space into a fully functional clinic.

It is our pleasure to be working alongside the Seager Memorial Clinic to help convert their newly acquired building into a modern medical clinic offering free healthcare to our most vulnerable friends. The Clinic is staffed by volunteers, both medical and non-medical, giving of their time to aid those who are

otherwise suffering. We likewise at HomeAid work with a network of builders and suppliers who generously give of their talent and resources to help us provide a space for this critical work to happen. It is through this collaborative effort that we can move the needle in this fight.

Over the past five years, HomeAid Utah has hosted an annual Diaper Drive to bolster the Utah Diaper Bank's vital work. Year after year, we have proudly maintained our position as their largest annual donor, consistently surpassing our previous records. In 2023, we introduced an exciting new element - the Diaper House Competition.

This competition challenged ten local businesses and groups to construct creative "diaper houses" made of at least 80% diapers. The response was astounding, and this innovative twist allowed us to not only meet but exceed our target of 750,000 diapers. This achievement is a testament to the power of compassion and creative engagement in service of those who require assistance. We are eager to build upon this success in the future, driven by our unwavering dedication to extending a helping hand to those in need.

On August 23, 2024, we hope to raise over 1,000,000 diapers in partnership with IKEA!

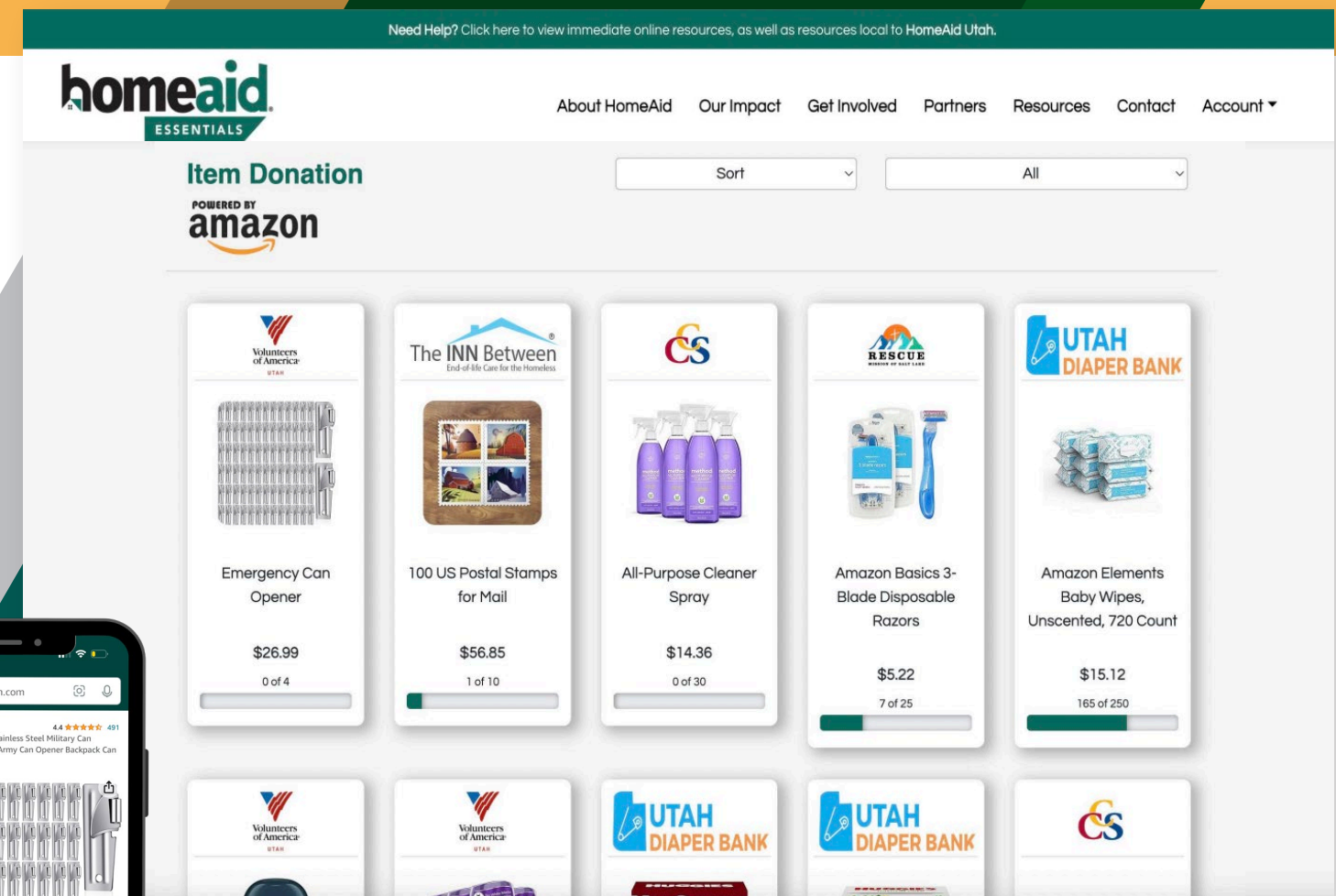
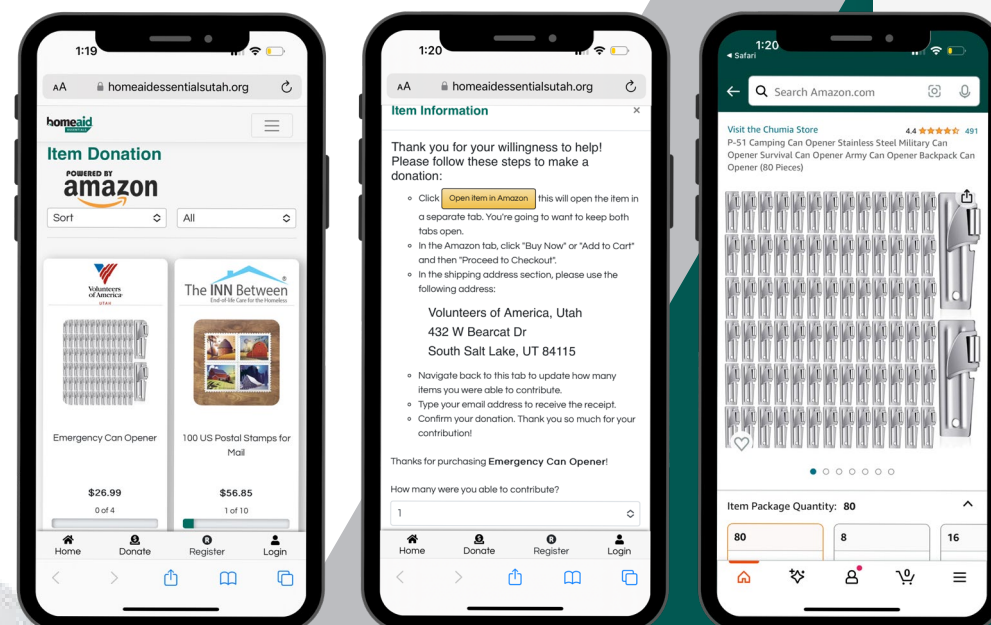

HOMEAID UTAH'S VIRTUAL GIVING MACHINE

The Virtual Giving Machine was developed in collaboration with a student team from BYU. Its purpose is to provide a one-stop site for the public to donate relevant, new items that are needed in real-time by participating providers of homeless services. During the final 2 months of 2020, HomeAid ran a Thanks4Giving campaign directing people to the site which resulted in the initial donation of over 23,000 unique items (over \$6,000 in value) to a variety of our front line service providers. To date, there have been over 36,734 items donated at a value of more than \$8,000.
